Afflicted by studies with poor sample sizes,
tiny effects, invalid exploratory analyses, and
flagrant conflicts of interest, together with an obsession
for pursuing fashionable trends of dubious importance;
science has taken a turn towards darkness.

WHY MEDICAL NIVILISM? OUTLINE

H : hypothesis that drug is effective

(1) highly potent → (2) highly specific

E : publicly available evidence concerning H

BAYES' RULE

$$P(H|E) = \frac{P(E|H) \cdot P(H)}{P(E)}$$

$P(E|H)$ low

* small effect sizes

$P(H)$ low

* few magic bullets

$P(\bar{E})$ high

* biased research

Now Go Through Each of These

p(E) HIGH

- SUBJECTS ARE BIASED

→ Pre-screen participants! (Run in period)

Where people are chosen to take part in trials based on some preferably criteria

- p-hacking

Checking to see if any of 20 hypotheses are supported by the data (i.e. $< 1/20$ chance of beyond produced by random)
Bound to find some result!

- publication bias

Only publish the successes!

You have to pass 2 clinical trials, but you can fail and not report as many as you want.

- Tools are biased

→ HAM-D

Depression questionnaire, need a drug to raise your HAM-D score by ~ 10 points to be significant.

You can gain points just by admitting you are depressed,

∴ a drug that makes you feel so bad you admit you are depressed has made significant progress to being approved!

p(R|H) low

SMALL EFFECT SIZES!

- Antidepressants \Rightarrow HAM-D \downarrow 1.8
- Tamoxifen for breast cancer \Rightarrow 2.8% reduction over 10 years
 \hookrightarrow serious intervention!
- Methylphenidate for ADHD \Rightarrow no patient benefits
- Statins \Rightarrow 1.2% lower mortality over 5 years
- Alendronate \Rightarrow 1% hip fractures over 5 years
- Oseltamivir \Rightarrow flu \downarrow from 7 to 6.3 days
- Cancer mortality \downarrow 5% 1950-2005

Compare that to truly revolutionary treatments

✓ INSULIN:

Coma patients code up!!

P(H) Low

Miracle cures (Magic bullets) are unlikely

↳ Complex diseases
↳ Complex system

Drugs that short-term make money
are unlikely to overcome these.

Some places: → antibiotics, scurvy, childhood cancers
are cheap → maybe genetic stuff
